Recipe of the Month

Recipe-S mores Pie

Ingredients:

Box of Gram Crackers = 14oz

20 oz of Milk Chocolate Bars

I Stick of butter=4oz

Marshmallows = 24oz bag

Cooking Items You will need-

9 1/2 inch glass or metal pie plate

I large bowl

I medium sized bowl

Cooking Spray or butter or some type of cooking grease.

Spatula

Directions:

1. Pre Heat Oven to 350 and grease the pie plate while you are doing the following

Making the Pie Crust

- 2. Melt the stick of butter in a microwave save bowl or melt in a small pot on the stove
- 3. Crush all of the gram crackers into tiny bits in a large bowl. Remove half of the gram crackers and place in another bowl for later use.
- 4. Add and mix the melted butter to the remaining gram cracker crumbles in the large bowl.
- 5. Use the Spatula to add and shape the butter gram cracker mixture to the greased pie plate.
- 6. Bake on a middle rack for about 6 minutes.

Filling the Pie

- 7. Remove the pie plate and add a layer of chocolate bars. Make sure you cover as much of the newly made pie crust as possible.
- 8. Add a layer of marshmallows on top of the chocolate.
- 9. Add a layer of crushed gram crackers from the bowl you set aside earlier.
- 10. Add another layer of chocolate bars.
- II. Add a final layer of marshmallows.
- 12. Return this yummyness to the oven for about 5 minutes.
- 13. Turn the oven to broil to toast the top layer of marshmallows. Watch the oven carefully.
- 14. Let cool for a couple of minutes or if you are brave dig in!!!
